What does TEMATEA provide?

- 1. Issue-Based Modules:** web-based reference tools that structure the action-oriented part of negotiated text from different relevant agreements in a logical framework.
- 2. Capacity Building** based on the modules to promote national cooperation and communication across conventions and sectors to improve national implementation.



1. The 'Issue-Based Modules'

- **Issue-Based** on key biodiversity issues: CC, PA, SU, IW, IAS, ABS
- Analysis of **existing** decisions of global and regional agreements on specific issues
- Analysis of **relationship** between decisions of different agreements to demonstrate overlaps, conflict or gaps
- Captures the '**action-oriented**' part of the decision in simplified language
- Voluntary and evolutionary, UN languages
- Web based and on CD Rom

Example: grouped obligations on IAS

Section: Management

Activity: Manage IAS - Component 1: Development management tools

Directly relevant obligations

- Establish or adapt existing IAS alert systems: [IPPC 7th ICPM, section 12.1, 148, 7h](#) <SEE COMMENTARY>
- Develop technical tools to support the management of IAS: [CBD Decision VI/23, 27](#) <SEE COMMENTARY>

Indirectly relevant obligations

- Integrate the conservation of migratory species habitats into policies, plans and programmes: [CMS Resolution 7.10, 2](#)

Commentary

[IPPC 7th ICPM, section 12.1, 148, 7h](#) and [CBD Decision VI/23, 27](#): The development of technical tool or alert systems may offer synergy between the two conventions

2. TEMATEA Capacity Building

- **Inventory of existing implementation of MEA obligations on 1 or more of the 6 topics:**

Norway: IAS, Seychelles: CC, Cuba: IW + IAS,

Peru: ABS, Georgia: PA, Belgium: CC

planned: Liberia, Armenia, Moldova

- **Evaluate Strengths and Weaknesses**
- **Formulate recommendations to improve national implementation**



Example: Cuba used results to prepare a GEF proposal on IAS and decided to repeat exercise on own expenses for PA, CC and ABS.

The **Inventory**, based on the issue-based structure of the modules, serves as a check-list to identify national obligations on a specific issue, coming from MEAs.

By completing the **checklist** with how these obligations were implemented at national level as well as the relevant actors, the inventory maps out the national efforts towards this issue.

Obligations & Commitments	National Activities	Actor
Enhance plant protection laws and policies, to include the protection of biodiversity against the impacts from IAS: IPPC 7th ICPM, section 12.1, 148, 7a		
Ensure that relevant laws and provisions do not inadvertently constrain the use of appropriate measures to address IAS: CBD Decision VIII/27, 64		
Review policy and legislation in light of the IAS Guiding Principles: CBD Decision VI/23, 10c and CBD Decision VI/23, Annex (IAS Guiding Principles)		
Consider the international cooperation guidelines when establishing or developing policy and legal frameworks relating to wetlands: Ramsar Resolution VII.19, 11 and Ramsar Resolution VII.19, Annex		
<i>Indirectly relevant provision:</i> Implement measures to reduce the impacts of climate change on migratory species: CMS Resolution 8.13, 3

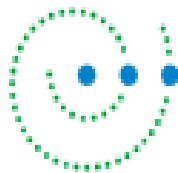
