Message 1: Already well entrenched in Policy

- Conservation Biology Perspective
 - Aichi Target 6 addresses target species, depleted species, bycatches, habitats, ecosystem structure and function
- Fisheries Management Perspective
 - Reykjavik Declaration 2001 references bycatch,
 habitats, ecosystem structure & function etc
 - UN Resolution 61/105 –burden of proof on fishing
 States and RFMOs

Message 2 Guidance on "how to" already exists

- Conservation Biology Perspective
 - Malawi Principles for an Ecosystem Approach
 (CBD COP/4/inf 9
- FAO Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries and Annexes on specific issues—
 - Guidance Doc 443 (2003 71 pages)
 - Multiple updates and revisions since

Message 3 - Coherence of Polices & Measures Crucial for Success

- Everyone agrees coherence between actions of conservation agencies and fisheries management agencies is necessary BUT COHERENCE IS <u>NOT</u> BOTH DOING THE SAME THING
- Coherence IS
 - Aligning goals of the agencies within their respective mandates
 - Each using their effective tools in complementary ways to reach those goals.
 - COMMUNICATION NOT POWER STRUGGLES
