

### 6. General information on access to Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago



Port of Spain is serviced by Piarco International Airport (about 32km southeast of the city of Port of Spain).

Transportation to and from the airport to the hotels will provided for delegates attending both meetings.

Please note that there is a Departure Tax of TT\$ 100 (Trinidad and Tobago dollar) (about US \$17) for all passengers leaving Trinidad and Tobago. Payment can be made in cash or by credit card.

## 7. Visa information



Participants from Caribbean countries listed below require an entry visa for Trinidad and Tobago and are strongly advised to contact the nearest Trinidad and Tobago diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure.

Countries and Territories from the Caribbean Region whose citizens require visas in order to enter Trinidad and Tobago as visitors are as follows:

- Cuba
- Dominican Republic
- Haiti
