

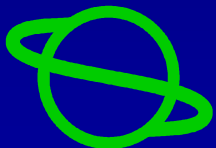

# Mainstreaming

- What does that mean?
- “Not just our problem”
- [somebody else’s problem too...]





# How is UNDP helping?

- Mainstreaming BD/ environment into our other work:
  - *Practices, PRSPs, CPAPs, CCFs, UNDAFs, CPDs, RCFs*
- But also working with “you” to help make BD “their” concern also





# Mainstreaming at the national level: Who?

- Sectoral ministries and industries (*tourism, fisheries, forestry, agriculture, but also; rural development, women's' affairs, health, education, etc...*)
- Spatial planning and land-use
- Economic development planning and finance





# Mainstreaming at the national level: How?

- Policy support
  - Adaptation to Climate Change and RCCEEP
- Programming
  - e.g. China CBPF
  - e.g. Philippines Biodiversity Programme
  - e.g. Malaysia mainstreaming into the NPP
- Capacity development
  - UNDP/UNEP Poverty and Environment Initiative (PEI)
