





The government agencies and administrations, NGOs and volunteers have developed separate country strategies to guide biodiversity, sustainable development and wider environmental conservation.











From Friday 27th March, we will be transferring the NBN Gateway website to new servers. This should ensure we have the capacity to continue growing for the forseeable future.



The total for the UK is 74.2% of 10km squares occupied. Monitoring information Monitoring will continue to be underpinned by the series of country national surveys, with the intention to repeat these on a seven-year rolling programme. These surveys should be repeated in time to inform the 2010 targets. These surveys have not all been comprehensive for all four countries nor have they been undertaken with the same frequency to date. Information will be supplemented by more local surveys and monitoring to inform the assessment of full distribution. Less intensive but more frequent, perhaps annual, monitoring protocols may be adopted in due course. However, the % positive sites information from national surveys provides a detailed level of information which has greater precision as a barometer of change in the status of the population than that based on 10km squares, even though population level cannot as yet be accurately estimated. Expand the distribution of otters to achieve 85% occupancy of 10 km squares by 2015. 


