#### Introduction

- Acceded to the UNCBD: 28/02/1996
- Completed the NBSAP in 2001
- NBSAP contains a vision, six goals and actions grouped under seven themes.

#### Outline and Main Features.

- Vision for Niue is to be a environmentally friendly nation that supports conservation and sustainable management of biodiversity to support a living community.
- Six goals include:
- Retaining and enhancing existing biodiversity
- Integrating biodiversity into government development policies and plans
- Improving local community understanding about biodiversity and mobilizing their participation in biodiversity conservation, sustainable use and benefitsharing
- Improving capacities for sustainable management of natural resources
- Developing financial mechanisms at various levels for conservation and sustainable management
- Strengthening environmental education and awareness and improving information sharing.

#### Outline and Main Features. (cont)

- Seven themes cover terrestrial habitats, terrestrial species, marine biodiversity, governance, waste management and water resources, alien invasive species and public awareness & education
- Priority actions identified previously:
- Protection of traditional knowledge
- In-situ and ex-situ conservation
- Protection of threatened species
- Establishing a database of biodiversity.

## Summary Developments.

- NBSAP developed on the basis of two legislations: the Environment Bill (Environment Act 2003) and the Integrated Environment Planning and Management Bill.
- The Agriculture & Quarantine Act and associated regulations
- Biosafety Framework.
- Development and implementation of Sustainable Forestry Management Plan
- Implementing forestry management activities.
- Implementing invasive species activities.
- National Waste Management Policy

#### Developments (cont)

- Promotion of Organic farming practices
- Completion of the National Capacity Self-Assessment (NCSA) on environmental management on Niue.
- Huvalu Conservation Area (Terrestrial) & Anono marine Reserve (Marine) established with more marine reserves being proposed.
- Draft National Integrated Strategic Plan (NISP 2009-2012). Multi-sector approach and stakeholder contributions.
- Etc...

### Inter-linkages

- Draft National Integrated Strategic Plan (NISP 2009-2012) Multi-sector approach and stakeholder contributions.
- Overlapping issues with other projects, agencies and sectors.
- NISP, MDGs, etc
- Need for more implementation than more planning.
- Hands-on approach for a more consistent standard of work.

## Biodiversity & Climate Change

- Climate change, mitigation and adaptation activities in the NBSAP were due to Biodiversity related activities and outcomes of consultation and not necessarily due to Climate Change.
- ◆ Inclusive approach to the Draft National Integrated Strategic Plan (NISP 2009-2012). Multi-sector approach and stakeholder contributions.
- Involvement of not only the three key agencies of Environment, DAFF and Department of Justice Lands & Surveying but also External Affairs, Economic Planning, Tourism, Treasury Department, Public Works Department etc

#### Information & Communication

- Stakeholder workshops, meetings and information over the local news.
- Consultants/Officials from regional/international Organisations appearing over the local news.
- Page adverts in the local paper.
- Website Development & implementation.
- Singing competitions
- Radio show fortnightly.
- Sponsorship for Village Activities.
- Sporting Activities!!!

### Opportunities

- Combining major projects i.e. Climate Change,
   Desertification and Biodiversity to utilise resources efficiently and avoid duplication of activities.
- Capacity Building? Who?
- More proactive approach in getting involved in the development of the Draft Niue Island Strategic Plan (2009-2012) consultations.
- Update & review the NBSAP.

### Challenges


- Establishment of the National Committee on Environmental/Sustainable Development as proposed under the Environment Act 2003 and details associated.
- Population decline?? Capacity Building???
- Maintaining the momentum with many different projects active and limited technical capacities.
- Communication with national planners for processes and development initiatives for National Strategic Plans.
- Communications with officials of Regional/International Organisations.
- Cyclone Heta 2004.

#### What could be done differently?

- All of Government approach to avoid "grey" areas between agencies, projects and activities.
- Information overloading on NGO's and the general public. Technical and language barriers to scientific explanation and terms used.
- Continuity of certain activities beyond projects.
