Online Discussion Forum Consultative Workshop on the Achievement of the 2010 Biodiversity Target in Dry and Sub-humid Lands

Dear Madam/Sir,

In paragraph 11(e) of decision VIII/2, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) requested the Executive Secretary, in collaboration with the Executive Secretary of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), to organize a consultative workshop on the achievement of the 2010 Biodiversity Target in dry and sub-humid lands.

In response to this request, the Secretariat is organizing an Online Discussion Forum to gather information on the identification of priority activities, capacity needs and obstacles with regard to the achievement of the 2010 Biodiversity Target in dry and subhumid lands. The final report will be presented at the ninth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP 9), to be held in Bonn, Germany, from 19-30 May 2008.
