**NOTIFICATION**  
**Clearing-House Mechanism Awards**

Dear Madam/Sir,

In decision XII/2 B, paragraph 15, the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity requested the Executive Secretary to propose, in collaboration with the Informal Advisory committee to the Clearing-House Mechanism (CHM-IAC), a process to grant, at the thirteenth, fourteenth and fifteenth meetings of the Conference of the Parties, subject to the availability of resources, an award to the Parties that made the most significant progress in the establishment or further development of their national clearing-house mechanisms.

In response to this decision, awards were granted at the thirteenth and fourteenth meetings of the Conference of the Parties. Further to consultations with the CHM-IAC, please find in annex I the modalities for granting the award at the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties. You are invited to submit your application to be considered for the award by completing an online questionnaire that will be available online at <https://www.chm-cbd.net/form/cop-15-award> by **30 June 2020**. The questionnaire may be completed on an ongoing basis between now and the questionnaire deadline. However, it is recommended that you review your submission and submit it only between 1 – 30 June 2020 to ensure that all activity is captured in your submission.

## **Modalities for the Clearing-House Mechanism (CHM) Award at COP 15**

### **Purpose**

The purpose of the CHM Award is to formally recognize the Parties that have made the most significant progress in the establishment or further development of their national clearing-house mechanisms, and it is a way to encourage Parties to make further efforts to do so. This award will be granted through a certificate signed by the Executive Secretary of the Convention on Biological Diversity.

### **Participation**

Each existing national CHM will be assessed provided that the requested relevant information is submitted to the CBD Secretariat through the corresponding questionnaire.

### **Categories of Awards**

There will be two categories of awards:

- Best “Existing” national CHM for Parties that had already established their national CHMs by COP 14.
- Best “New” national CHM for Parties that have established or updated and relaunched their national CHMs after COP 14 and prior to COP 15.

Please refer to annex V to see the current status of national Clearing-House Mechanisms.

In each category, three awards will be granted:

1. The gold award for the winner.
2. The silver award for the second position.
3. The bronze award for the third position.

### **Certificates of Achievement**

Upon recommendations of the Jury, the Executive Secretary may also grant a Certificate of Achievement to Parties that have made significant progress in the development of their national CHM between COP 14 and COP 15.

### **Jury**

- A jury will be established by the Executive Secretary and will include CHM-IAC members to ensure regional representation.
- Jury members who are Party representatives will not be allowed to assess their own national CHM.
- Guidance will be provided to jury members.

### **Criteria**

The criteria in the table below will be used to assess each national CHM.
