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Setting the scene

- Disconnect between local and national data and global assessments (of progress to global targets).
- Many lessons learned and opportunities to build on existing mechanisms under the Convention(s) and other processes.
- Understanding progress against global targets depends on transparent and coherent national commitments and implementation.

Monitoring - indicators

- Analysis of 5NRs - Parties use a wide range of quantifiable, evidence-based indicators.
- Parties 11x more likely to use national indicators than global indicators.
- Challenge in understanding progress towards national targets and assessing progress towards global goals.
- Overall limited indicators used in 5 NRs to report on progress under Goals A, D and E of the 2011-2020 SP.

Nationally planned actions

- Many opportunities for improving the reporting process to enable analysis of national reports and greater understanding of:
 - nationally planned actions
 - progress in their implementation over time
 - priority areas where further action is required
- Biodiversity-relevant actions and commitments over and above those in NBSAPs – eg NDCs.

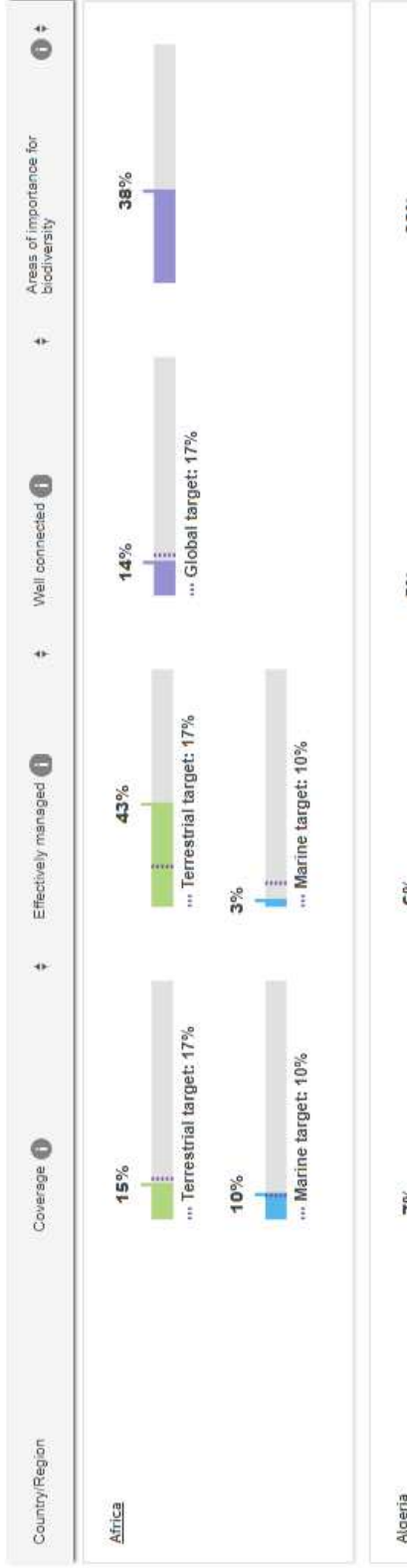

Aichi Target 11 Dashboard

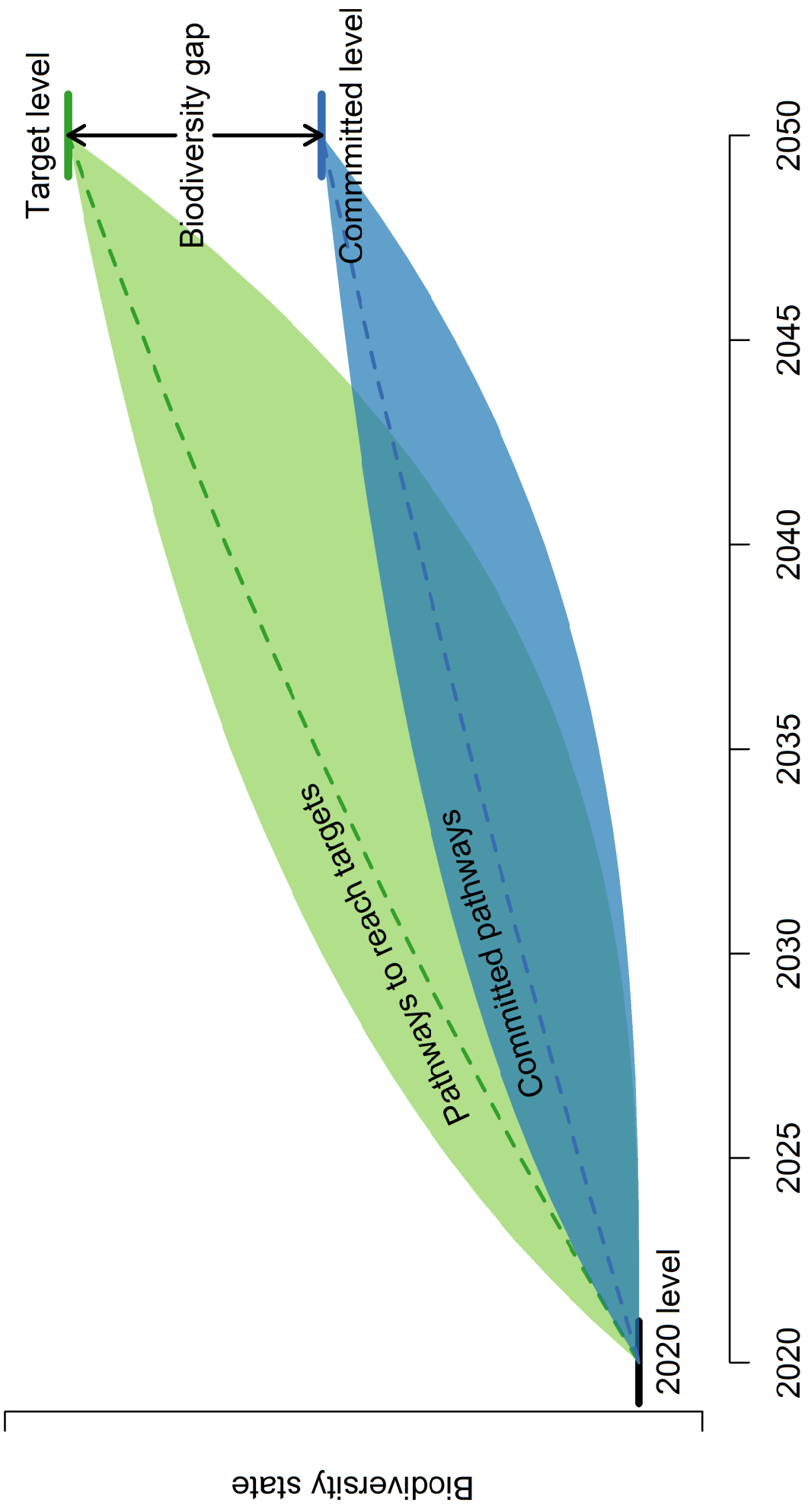


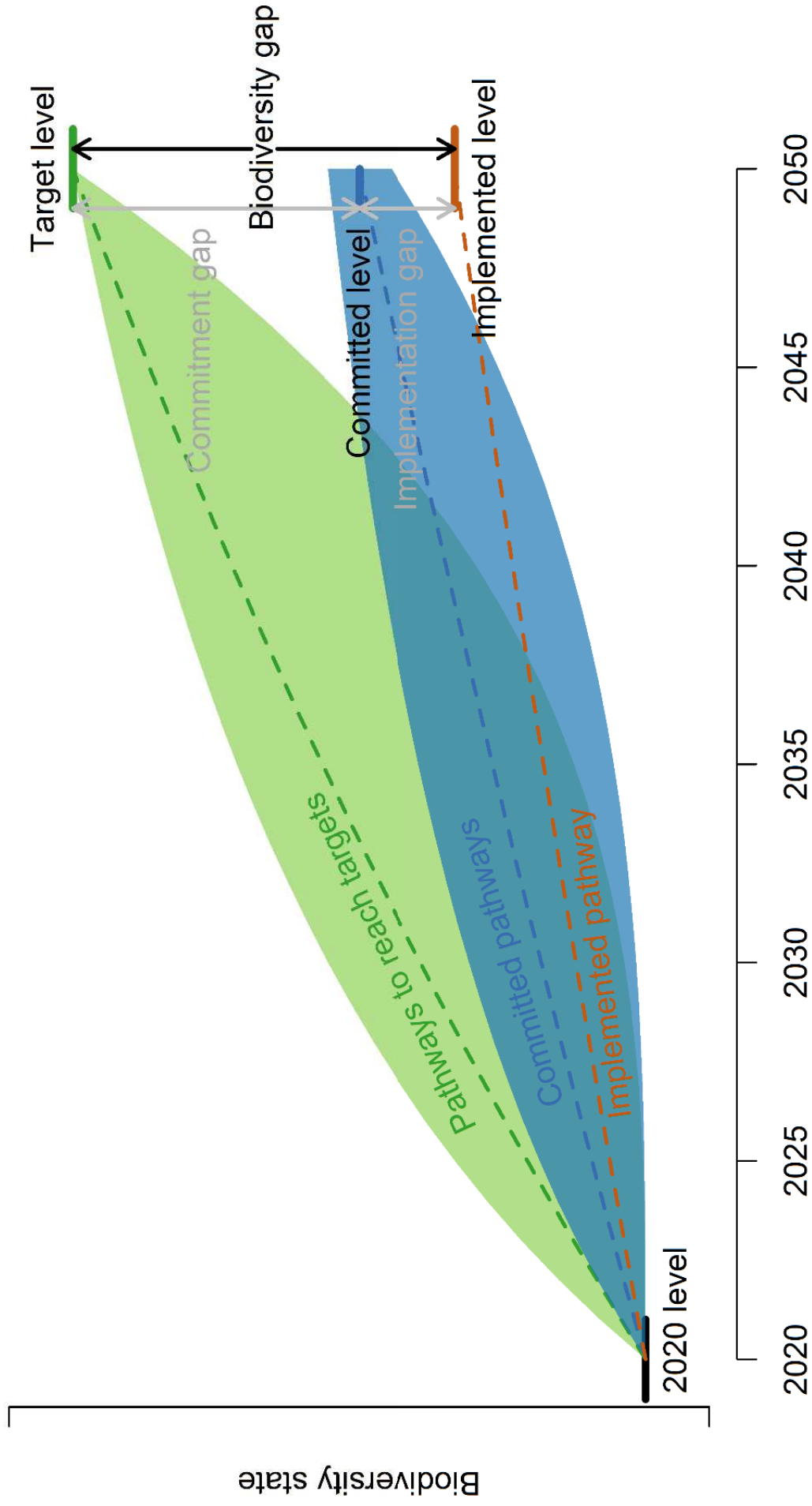

Opportunities from a target tracking tool

- Enables a regular global stocktake
- Facilitates regular reporting on a set of “headline indicators”
- Strengthens understanding of relationship between national commitments and global targets/goals
- Understanding of aggregate impact of national implementation
- Builds on existing mechanisms – eg WDPA, UN SEEA EEA, Decision Tracking Tool
- Links to other tools – DaRT, ORT etc

Options for the role of a target/goal tracking tool:

- Maintained by SCBD as a mechanism for tracking progress towards the post-2020 framework by CBD Parties.
- Maintained by SCBD as a mechanism for tracking progress on post-2020 framework by all stakeholders – building on Action Agenda and other MEA reporting processes.
- Independent system to provide overview and analysis of progress on post-2020 framework – eg UNEP Emission's Gap report.
- An input to agreed reporting processes, among other channels.

Contribution from non-State actors

- Need to also capture information on commitments, actions and outcomes from non-State actors (and non-Parties)
- To be added to commitments and progress made by Parties to provide a more overall assessment.
- Building on existing and ongoing platforms:
 - Action Agenda for People and Nature
 - Science-Based Targets

To be effective, such a mechanism requires...

- SMART global and national targets
- Coherent use of a set of indicators/metrics for monitoring
- Regular reporting on these indicators/metrics
- Strengthened capacity for national data management
- Seamless connections with existing tools - DaRT, ORT, WDPA, UN SEEA EEA, Decision Tracking Tool, Action Agenda etc etc
- Capacity (in SCBD or elsewhere) for curation and analysis
