BACKGROUND

Through the REDD & Biodiversity e-Newsletter, the CBD Secretariat will regularly compile and disseminate recent information on biodiversity benefits in the framework of Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (REDD)¹. Contributors² can include NGOs, Parties, other governments, international organizations, independent experts, and the private sector.

1. CONTENT

Contributions can describe new projects, products (publications, etc.), events, or any other information that could be of relevance for the target audience.

2. AUDIENCE & STYLE

- The primary audience are the 191 Parties to the CBD, and the wider conservation community.
- The secondary audience are government and non-government experts involved in the development of a REDD mechanism in the framework of the UNFCCC, and related pilot activities.
- A concise style with a minimum of jargon / acronyms is encouraged.

3. LENGTH

• A headline plus a maximum of 4 lines (max. 60 words) per news item, with a hyperlink for more information (mandatory).

4. LAYOUT

Layout is undertaken by the Secretariat.
