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The competition was open to all, not just IAIA members. The goal was to inspire interesting, unique and exciting perspectives, insights, epiphanies and experiences involving nature and/or "nature as muse or inspiration." There were three submission categories: 1) written submissions comprising short stories or poems; 2) photographs of species, landscapes or any form of biodiversity on its own or in relation to human wellbeing; and 3) images of 2- or 3-dimensional art works in any media such as logos, material, or jewelry designs, prints, or paintings.

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The six winning entries are posted on IAIA's website at <http://iaia.org/inspired-by-nature/> and were recognized in its January 2011 newsletter. The six winners and nine honorable mentions were also featured on a large poster displayed at IAIA11.
