## **UNAAB Is Committed To BioDiversity Sustainability — VC**

The Vice-Chancellor, Professor Oluwafemi Olaiya Balogun has described the newly established Institute of Food Security, Environmental Resources and Agricultural Research (IFSERAR) in the University as a confirmation of the University's commitment to the sustainability of biodiversity. Speaking at the Opening Ceremony of a symposium, to mark the International Year of Biodiversity at the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Professor Balogun reiterated the University's commitment towards promoting agricultural productivity with unequivocal concern for the environment. He said UNAAB, was one of the three specialized institutions in Nigeria, which is committed to the improvement of agricultural productivity with emphasis on a stable environment for the continued promotion of a safe and productive universe. Stressing that the University would do everything to encourage the sustainability of biodiversity, Prof Balogun said "we are particularly pleased with the programme of activities, especially the tree-planting campaign and would do all we can to encourage these activities, both locally and within the University's landscape and our mandate . . ."

The Vice-Chancellor, who was represented at the occasion by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Christopher Onwuka pointed out that the prevailing awareness on biodiversity across the world and Nigeria was particularly a move towards the right. direction.

Corroborating him, the convener of the event, Professor Segun Ayodele emphasized the need to promote biodiversity in the world as a catalyst against factors which may enhance adverse climate change. He noted that this rich diversity was being lost at an accelerated rate, due to human activities. The world relied on the diversity of life to provide man with food, fuel, medicine and other essentials in which we cannot live without, he added. Professor Ayodele, therefore, called on all to help preserve this irreplaceable natural wealth and biodiversity degradation.
