24th-28th of May- Biodiversity Music Festival. Local music composers' creativities are exposed and public judging on the best song for the IYB 2010 ceremony and in particular the importance of Tuvalu Biodiversity

24th of May- Terrestrial & Marine Awareness Programmes targeting the youths. Launching of Tuvalu Species Book and their importances. This is a synergy between Department of Environment (NBSAP Projects), NGOs (Tuvalu Association of NGOs & Alofa Tuvalu) and Pacific regional organizations (South Pacific Regional Environment Programme, University of the South Pacific, Secretariat of Pacific Community.

25th of May- Women, Eco-Tourism and Biodiversity. Talks and awareness programmes will be delivered by the Human Rights Advocator and Tourism officer.

31st of May-5th of June-Biodiversity Queen Beauty Pageant. This is a week event with each day carrying and portraying a particular theme which adds up to the theme Biodiversity is Life. The contestants for the pageant are to educate themselves on the public on the various themes.
