17 October, Nagoya, Japan - Vanuatu will be showcasing several of its successes in nature conservation by featuring as guest speakers at key events during the 10th Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD COP10) in Nagoya, Japan over the next two weeks.

The Government of Japan is the host of the CBD COP 10, bringing together thousands of people from around the globe to negotiate on ways to universally work together to help save the Planet's biodiversity. As part of the Pacific coordination at the CBD COP 10, the issues on the agenda which have a common interest are shared. These issues are being addressed by different country representatives and Vanuatu is following the topics Agricultural Biodiversity and Forestry Biodiversity on behalf of the Pacific.

"Food security in Vanuatu is an important issue, more so in the face of the climate change impacts, and so we are working towards going back to our traditional methods to improve and strengthen what we already have in Vanuatu."
