Current Status

- <u>Terrestrial</u> National Park systems plan based on vegetation and land forms has 39 Natural Regions, along with national wildlife areas, and provincial and territorial parks, and indigenous protected area
 - Edéhzhíe Protected Area is the first IPA
 - Currently 10.5% of Canada's land and freshwater is protected
- <u>Marine</u> areas can be designated to provide for the conservation and protection of:
 - commercial and non-commercial fishery resources, including marine mammals, and their habitats
 - -endangered or threatened marine species, and their habitats unique habitats
 - marine areas of high biodiversity or biological productivity
 - any other marine resource or habitat as is necessary to fulfil the mandate of the Minister
 - Currently at 7.92% (federal, provincial MPAs and federal OECMs)




Management effectiveness; Governance and Equity

Federal NP – State of individual Parks Report every 10 years, State of system of parks every 5 years, tabled in Parliament

Marine....regular state of oceans (Atlantic, Arctic, Pacific) reports, but not specific to MPAs.

Green List - Early discussions in Quebec, Canada - Mexico is leading the way

Specific gaps identified for elements of Target 11

- New WWF Canada report 'A National Habitat Crisis'
 - 84 per cent of habitats with high concentrations of at-risk species are inadequately or not at all protected.

Opportunities

Opportunities identified which could address specific gaps identified for elements of Target 11

- <u>Canada's Nature Legacy</u> investment of \$1.35 billion over 5 years includes a new Canada Nature Fund to support the protection of Canada's ecosystems and biodiversity, including species at risk.
- The Nature Fund represents a \$500 million federal investment to be matched by philanthropic, corporate, not-for-profit, provincial, territorial and other partners. It includes:
- 1. A Quick Start component that awarded almost \$15 million to help establish 39 near ready protected and other conserved areas across Canada in 2018-19 to build momentum;
- A Challenge component which anticipates up to \$175 million in federal funding to support the
 establishment of up to 35 Indigenous Protected and Conserved Areas and other protected and
 conserved areas, thereby making significant progress towards Canada Target 1 and contributing
 meaningfully to reconciliation; and
- 3. The Natural Heritage Conservation Program (NHCP), a funding program providing \$100 million over 4 years to protect ecologically sensitive areas through the securement of private lands and interests across the country.








Opportunities

Opportunities identified which could address specific gaps identified for elements of Target 11

 Protected areas include Marine Protected Areas created under the Oceans Act, National Marine Conservation Areas, and marine portions of National Wildlife Areas, Migratory Bird Sanctuaries, National Parks, and provincial protected areas. Protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures (OEABCM) both contribute to meeting the 10 percent target.
