Report from the European Environment Agency (EEA) "Progress towards halting the loss of biodiversity by 2010"

Chapter 3.3 of the report covers Freshwater Ecosystems and reports inter alia on

- Rivers and lakes in Europe
- Trends in Species
- Key management issues

The conclusions of the report identify issues where urgent action and more concrete efforts are needed (http://reports.eea.europa.eu/eea_report_2006_5/en/eea_report_5_2006.pdf).

Streamlining European 2010 Biodiversity Indicators (SEBI 2010)

The EC submits information on the implementation of its main operational tool for water protection the Water Framework Directive (WFD).

The submission includes the communication from the Commission - Towards sustainable water management in the European Union - First stage in the implementation of the Water Framework Directive 2000/60/EC
